

The Common Rhinoplasty Side Effects

Are you contemplating having a nose job but are concerned about rhinoplasty side effects? It is normal and predictable to have concerns. Especially since the procedure requires cutting on your face. Rhinoplasty side effects are rare and complications are minor. However, all surgery has its own undesirable outcomes. To avoid any of those, you just need to be very obedient to whatever will be prescribed. There is no harm in following somebody who is more knowledgeable in that area even if it is inconvenient on your part.

The list below details the common rhinoplasty side effects:

* Bleeding

To reduce the potential for this serious rhinoplasty side effect, the patient should not push to blow the nose. Bleeding can even be up to one week or four months. It may be that long so patience is really a requirement here.

* Wound infections

The chances of having these rhinoplasty side effects are lower than two percent. There is always the availability of antibiotics and drainage to remedy abscesses, cellulites and granuloma. Actually, the use of an implant increases the rate of wound infections.

* Abnormal shape

This is one of the rhinoplasty side effects that the factors can go beyond human control. An abnormal shape of the nose can be brought about by a lapse during surgical procedures; the patient's head was not kept elevated and sleeping on one area without proper splint. The nose can pull to one side if the cast does not support it correctly.

* Burst blood vessels

You may notice small, red spots on your nose after the surgery. They are rhinoplasty side effects due to the blood vessels that ruptured. Take note because they can also be permanent. However, it does not happen most of the time but it should not be neglected.

* Toxic shock syndrome

In an article authored by S. Valentine Fernandes, it was written there that the complication rate for nasal surgery varies from 4% - 18.8% in individual hands, this rate generally falls as surgical experience accumulates. Skin and associated soft tissue complications occur in up

to 10% of cases. According to estimates, severe systemic or life-threatening complications occur in 1.7-5% of rhinoplasty cases. Intracranial complications are rare."

This is also one of the rhinoplasty side effects that are not most likely to happen. According to statistics, the percentage of occurrence is only 0.016%. It does not show, the mortality rate is about 11%. Fever, vomiting, diarrhea and sunburn- like rash are the common symptoms.

In a study conducted, about 10% of all those who have experienced nose jobs needed follow- up surgical operations. This is due to the impediments that come up or when the nose does not look right after. Medical practitioners will wait for another year before a patient will go under the knife.

During your visit you will have the procedure explained in detail as well as the rhinoplasty side effects put in plain words for you to calculate the risks. You may even get to have a computer model of your face made so you can get a preview of your new nose.
